


We know that times are difficult for many. The student bursary is here to support you and your family with the cost of college. If you can evidence financial need, here are some of the costs we could help you with:



#### **APPLICATIONS FOR 2022-2023**

#### What is the 16-19 Bursary Fund?

The fund is made available from the government through its funding body – Education and Skills Funding Agency (ESFA) for 16-18 year olds - to provide assistance to students whose access to, or completion of, education is inhibited by financial constraints or barriers. The Bursary Scheme for 16 – 18 year olds has been put in place as a partial replacement for Education Maintenance Allowance (EMA).


#### Who is eligible to apply for 16-19 Bursary Funding?


Students following government (ESFA) funded full time or part-time courses, who are 16 years and over and satisfy one or more of the following criteria:


- Students aged at least 16 and under 19 years of age on 31/08/22 who are in care, are leaving care, are in direct receipt of Income Support or are disabled and in receipt of both Employment Support Allowance and Disability Living Allowance.
- Students who are economically or socially disadvantaged and at risk of not taking up or continuing in their education. This group

## What happens next?

- Mrs Mordue, Shelly Challoner, and our finance support team will approve your application or arrange a meeting with you to discuss.
- If we approve applications, you will receive an email to your college address asking you to then make a claim.
- A claim can then be approved and put straight into your account, or a regular payment can be given depending on the type of transport you use, for example.
- You can make additional claims at any time up to the amount you have been awarded for the year.
