End of Half-term Letter from the Head of School

Dear Parents and Carers,

As we approach the end of our first half-term for some time without restrictions in the classroom because of Covid, I would like to update you on several issues. Our students have simply been magnificent this half-term. They have embraced returning to a classroom free of 'teaching zones' and have fully exemplified our 'Work Hard, Be Kind, Take Pride' ethos in both the classroom and beyond.

COVID-19 Testing During the October Half-term Break

I encourage our staff and students to test twice weekly at home over this period, as well as testing at home the evening before they return to our school. I thank you for your committed approach to such testing this half-term.

I am pleased to report that we have seen a steady decline in student cases over the last two weeks and we hope this trend continues. As ever, if numbers rise next half-term, we will continue to liaise closely with the Department for Education and Public Health England about the school's response to maximize the safety of our school community.

COVID-19 Vaccinations for 12 to 15-year-olds

We expect these vaccinations to take place in school next half-term. The NHS will be running this programme and we will serve as the host. The Department for Education and NHS stress that vaccinating children should help to reduce the need for children to have time off school and reduce the risk of spreading COVID-19 within schools.

Please note that the nature of this nationwide vaccination programme will mean that parents often receive quite late notice, often being informed the day before vaccinations take place.
