Toot Hill College Year 13 results 2019:

33% A'-A pass rate for A-Level and Vocational

A'-C pass rate for A-Level and Vocational A'-E pass rate for A-Level and Vocational

THE REAL PROPERTY.

In 2019, 83% of all student entries were graded A*-C. The college also secured a 99% pass rate in all A-Level and vocational courses, reflecting the high academic rigour that is expected.

On average, a grade B was achieved by students on A-Level courses in 2019 (firmly above the national average) and a Distinction (equivalent to a grade A) was achieved by students on vocational courses.

Moreover, every student who wished to continue into higher education secured a university place.

Ofsted stated that sixth form provision was good with good leadership and management enabling students to achieve good outcomes.

Ethos and aims

At Toot Hill College, we have a clear strategy for success:

Commitment: Toot Hill College is committed to providing a world class learning environment. In turn, we have the highest expectations of all students; we encourage all students to develop as independent learners, helping them to access their full potential both academically, and as young adults.

Community: Toot Hill College facilitates a fantastic range of curricular and extra-curricular opportunities that promote a true learning community. The college aims to develop leaders of the future with initiatives such as the Student Union, the Toot Hill College Passport (which accredits 100 hours of community volunteering) and Silver and Gold Duke of Edinburgh's Award. The Senior Citizens' Tea Dance and Children's Christmas Party further provide our students with the opportunity to engage with the wider community.

Consideration: We aim to support the development of all students on their path to adulthood. At Toot Hill College, our staff are proud to provide care and consideration for all students. Enrichment

Duke of Edinburgh's Award (D of E)

This provides you with the opportunity to try new activities, develop key life skills and contribute to the local community through the 'volunteering' section. You will complete the final assessment by planning and completing, as a team, a fully self-sufficient expedition in the Peak District.

Travelteer Expedition

You will complete a two-week expedition abroad as a team, including a community project, a challenging trek and a sight-seeing element. Previous trips have taken place to Morocco, Sri Lanka, Thailand and Romania. This is the ultimate opportunity for you to respond to mental and physical challenges that will enable you to develop skills and gain experiences that will stay with you for life.

Students' Union (Senior Prefects)

An active Students' Union enables greater autonomy for students in the creation of a 'higher education' ethos and provides opportunities for consultation regarding key college decisions. Sub-committees take responsibility for key college foci including events (such as the annual Christmas Party and College Summer Ball), teaching and learning facilities, links with the lower school and the college newsletter.

Work Experience

You will be encouraged to find a placement which supports your interests and career aspirations. Work experience takes place at the end of Year 12 and helps you develop additional experience in support of your UCAS application.



Engineering Education Scheme

This scheme links Year 12 students with a local STEM business to work on real-life scientific, engineering and technical problems. Over the course of a six-month programme, you will get the opportunity to complete your British Association Crest Award.

Young Enterprise

A national competition where you form a company to design, create, advertise and sell a product or service to be showcased at local and regional events with support from business leaders in the local community.

Community Sports Leadership Award

An engaging and practical experience that enables you to develop leadership, communication, organisation and teamwork skills through the planning and leading of sports festivals for local primary school children.

Toot Hill College Passport

A unique Toot Hill College programme that accredits you for 100 hours of volunteering in the school and local community. You are provided with opportunities to volunteer in subject curriculum classes or after-school clubs, work with individual pupils through learning support or become an Arts Academy mentor working with pupils from local primary schools.

Extended Project Qualification (EPQ)

Well-respected and recommended by top universities, Year 13 students are offered the opportunity to research and write a 5,000-word project on a topic of their choice. You will be provided with a mentor who offers one-to-one support and advice and you will complete the final assessment by presenting your findings to senior members of staff in college.

Facilities

Toot Hill College has an excellent range of services available to students. This includes:

- Access to up-to-date facilities, including independent learning areas, a dedicated UCAS office and The Curve Restaurant
- Extensive computing and ICT facilities
- Dedicated study support spaces and resources, available throughout the day to assist you with your study including our growing on-site library of course-specific resources
- A design, technology and graphics area
- An expressive arts area with drama, art and music facilities (including drama studios, photography dark room facilities, college art studio and music practice rooms)
- Eleven science laboratories
- Exclusive use of Bingham Leisure Centre with subsidised gym membership

The college provides a dedicated mentoring programme.


Each student is assigned a dedicated mentor during their time at Toot Hill College.

In Year 12, the mentor programme incorporates:

- Student well-being

In Year 13, the focus is on university, apprenticeships and employment applications:

- Apprenticeship applications
- Looking for jobs

- Providing university and job references
- Offering study and revision support
- Student well-being
- Dedicated one-to-one interviews



Advice and choosing the right subjects

Students will select three courses to study from the beginning of Year 12, which they will continue throughout the duration of their two years at Toot Hill College.

All courses that we offer are graded as 'Level 3' qualifications by Ofqual, which means they are all of equal difficulty and accepted equally by the majority of universities, apprenticeship and employment opportunities.

Students have the choice of selecting any combination of three A-Levels, which tend to be more heavily exam-based in their assessment, and/or vocational qualifications such as BTEC or Technical Level qualifications, which have a greater proportion of coursework as part of their assessment.

In addition, some students may wish deliberately to select a greater number of 'facilitating subjects' as their A-Level choices; these are A-Level courses that have been specifically recommended by some top universities and include English Literature, Mathematics, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, History, Geography, French, German and Spanish.

How to apply

The application cycle for students wishing to study at Toot Hill College from September 2020 onwards will open on Friday 8 November 2019. The final deadline for receiving applications will be on Friday 17 January 2020. Nevertheless, we advise applying as early as possible as places may fill up quickly.

In order to complete the online application form, you will need to supply:

- Your personal and contact details
- Your current school details
- Your GCSE predicted grades
- A personal statement detailing why you are applying to Toot Hill College
- Your provisional course choices

Once we have received your online application, if successful you will be invited to interview during the spring term of 2020.

Entry requirements

Toot Hill College has general entry requirements which all students must meet in order to study here. The general college entry requirements are a **grade 4 in GCSE English Language** and a **grade 4 in GCSE Mathematics**.

There are also course-specific entry requirements which you must meet in order to study particular courses.

In order to study an A-Level course, you must achieve a **grade 5 or above in a relevant GCSE subject(s)**. In order to study a vocational course, you are recommended to have achieved a **grade 4 or above in a relevant GCSE subject(s)**.
